

Dear Ann:

Enclosed you will find a shadow box. This is our way of honoring a Boise Valley member who recently passed away.

His name is Tom Young; he was born in Memphis Tennessee in 1922. In 1942 he received a commission as a 2nd lieutenant in the U.S. Army Air Corp and his pilot wings in 1944. As a B-17 pilot, his plane was shot down over Germany in November 1944 becoming a POW for six months before being rescued by allied troops.

After the war he attended the American Academy of Art. As a reservist he was recalled to the U.S. Air Force during the Korean War. Tom served as an instructor pilot and training aids officer. After the war Tom returned to his profession as an artist/animator.

Upon his retirement in 2001 he and his wife Mary moved to Boise to be near their son and his family. While in Boise he was one of the founding members of the Boise Valley POW/MIA Corporation. He continued to support the BV POW/MIA Corp until his death. He has always said he feels at home with fellow members and had a special bond with each of us.

Upon his death he requested that in lieu of flowers donations be made to the BV POW/MIA Corp and the Lions Club. Enclosed you will also find a check to the National League of Families for the amount donated.

In the shadow box you will see the POW/MIA patch, the Boise Valley patch, in fact Tom Young designed this Boise Valley patch, and a photo of Tom in front of B-17 "Liberty Bell". The aircraft was in Boise on tour and Tom had the opportunity to take a flight in this aircraft and sign the door. It was one time we got to really see his great smile. That is why this photo is so special to us. We ask that you find a place of honor for this shadow box in your offices for Tom, as he was a special person and deserves to be honored in the offices of the organization which he held in so high esteem.
